Don't spoil your trip by being an easy target for thieves

How to avoid being a victim of crime

While crime is not a major problem in the Mourne's, by following these easy steps, you can reduce your chance of becoming a victim

- Remember, while you might be taking time off, thieves are not. Don't give them an easy ride. Try to park your vehicle in a well lit and well used area.
- Before you leave your car, caravan or tent, double check you have shut all your windows and locked all your doors. Think about padlocking your tent and putting any valuables out of sight or at least in the boot.
- Don't leave anything of value on display - most break-ins to cars, caravans and tents are by opportunists who see something worth stealing.



How to report problems

- If you have a mobile phone, carry it with you and make sure it is charged.
- Carry a pen and paper (and this leaflet).
- If you see anything suspicious, write down as much useful information as possible - eg the time, location, description of the problem, vehicle registration, type and colour of vehicle, numbers of people involved, what they look like and what they are wearing.
- Fill out the form on the back of this leaflet.
- Remember, you don't have to confront someone. Your first priority is your own safety.
- In an emergency - always call 999 or 112.
- If you want to report crime anonymously, call Crimestoppers confidentially on 0800 555 111.

Countryside Code

By following these easy steps, you can help to ensure the Mourne's remain an asset to treasure for generations to come:

- Always take your litter with you or use the bins provided.
- Be a responsible dog owner, keep your dog under control, carry dog waste bags and use dog waste bins where these have been provided.
- Only camp on permitted sites.
- Only light fires or barbecues on permitted sites.
- Respect the areas designated as 'No Drinking' under Alcohol Bylaws.
- Don't disturb wildlife or cut trees or any vegetation.
